CONSTITUTIONAL LITIGATION

The School of Law offers an LLM programme in Constitutional Litigation.

Programme outcomes

The programme aims to develop a specialised knowledge of aspects of Constitutional Litigation, and to provide students with the opportunity to make use of comparative materials.

Programme structure

Students are required to complete four modules from the prescribed list of modules, and to complete a 20 000-word dissertation. Although all modules are presented after hours, it is possible to register as a full-time or a part-time student. Full-time students may register for two modules each semester and may complete their degrees in one year, while part-time students will be allowed to register for one module each semester and complete their degrees in two years. Programme teaching method

Seminars are held at the School of Law, Howard College Campus, Mondays to Thursdays from 17:15 until about 20:00. Attendance at seminars is compulsory.

Programme modules

- Advanced Constitutional Law
- History and Philosophy of Constitutionalism
- Politics of Law

Programme teachers

The programme will be team-taught by Constitutional Law experts and practitioners.

Eligibility

Applicants must be in possession of an LLB or a BProc degree with the basic entrance requirement being a minimum overall average of 60%.

Structural support for your LLM

A Centre for Postgraduate Legal Studies has been established within the School of Law on the Howard College Campus to offer a supportive environment in which postgraduate law students may conduct their research and writing. There are six offices and fifteen computers, and a discussion room where students may engage in group projects and interact socially (there are coffee and tea-making facilities). The aim is to provide a welcoming environment which promotes serious and relevant legal research, as well as interactive learning.
